Week 1 Exodus 1:1-22

1. After Joseph and all of his generation died, what happened to the people of Israel?
2. Why did Pharaoh try to kill the Hebrew (Israelite) babies?
3. Who did the midwives serve and obey?

Week 2 Exodus 2:1-25

1. Who adopted Moses, and why?
2. What did Moses (who was a Hebrew) do when he saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew?
3. Who did Moses marry, and how did they meet?

Week 3 Exodus 3:1-22

1. Who is the Angel of the Lord? (For a hint, read Genesis 32:29, Judges 13:18, and Isaiah 9:6.)
2. How did Moses respond when God told him to go to Pharaoh?
3. Compare verse 14 with Isaiah 44:6. What does the name "I AM" tell us about God?

Week 4 Exodus 4:1-31

1. What three signs did God allow Moses to perform so that the people would believe him?
2. How did God say that Pharaoh would respond to the miracles that Moses would perform?
3. What did Moses and Aaron each do once they returned to Egypt?

Week 5 Review (Pick One)

1. Make a list of at least 5 different ways in which you can see God protecting His people throughout the first 4 chapters of the book of Exodus.
2. Write a summary, poem, skit, or song of what you learned from the Bible this week.
3. Draw a picture of what you learned from the Bible this week. Write a brief description of your picture.

Week 6 Exodus 5:1-23

1. After refusing to let them go and worship, what new command did Pharaoh give to the Hebrews, and what was his reasoning?
2. After being given a harder workload, who did the Hebrew people blame, and what did they say?
3. What did Moses say when he cried out to God?

Week 7 Exodus 6:1-13, 28 – 7:13

1. God responds to the people's lack of faith in verses 1-8. List 2 things that He tells Moses.
2. Why did the people not listen to what God told them through Moses?
3. What happened when the magicians tried to duplicate Aaron's miracle with his staff?

Week 8 Exodus 7:14 – 8:19

1. Describe what happened during the first plague and how long it lasted.
2. What happened during the second plague, and how did Pharaoh respond?
3. During the third plague, what did the magicians say to Pharaoh, and why?

Week 9**Exodus 8:20 – 9:12**

1. What did God do differently during the fourth plague to clearly show which people belonged to Him?
2. What happened during the fifth plague that was different from the first four?
3. Compare the sixth plague to what is foretold in Revelation 16:2.

Week 10**Review (Pick One)**

1. Make a 4-column chart of the 6 plagues covered so far. In the first column, write the numbers 1 through 6. In the second column, write what happened during the plague. In the third column, write whether or not the magicians were able to duplicate the plague. In the fourth column, write whether or not the Hebrew people were affected by that plague.
2. Write a summary, poem, skit, or song of what you learned from the Bible this week.
3. Draw a picture of what you learned from the Bible this week. Write a brief description of your picture.

Week 11**Exodus 9:13 – 10:20**

1. For what purpose did God say He raised Pharaoh up?
2. How did the seventh plague test each person's individual obedience?
3. What was the condition of the land of Egypt after the plague of locusts?

Week 12**Exodus 10:21 – 11:10**

1. What did Pharaoh initially give the Hebrews permission to do after the plague of darkness?
2. What did God say Pharaoh would do after the final plague?
3. What does verse 7 tell us about the distinction between those who belong to God and those who do not?

Week 13**Exodus 12:1-28**

1. According to verses 13, 23, and 27, what is the meaning of the word "Passover"?
2. Compare verse 5 with Hebrews 9:13-14. How does the unblemished lamb give us a picture of Christ?
3. What was God going to do to the Egyptians and to the Israelites during the tenth and final plague?

Week 14**Exodus 12:29-51**

1. How did the Egyptians react to the final plague, and what did Pharaoh say to Moses and Aaron?
2. Compare the number of men among the people of Israel at this time to the number of people in Jacob's family who originally went down to Egypt (see Genesis 46:27).
3. What yearly Jewish celebration was instituted on this night?

Week 15**Review (Pick One)**

1. Make a list of at least 3 things from chapters 9-12 that are a foreshadowing of Christ and explain how each of those things points to Christ.
2. Write a summary, poem, skit, or song of what you learned from the Bible this week.
3. Draw a picture of what you learned from the Bible this week. Write a brief description of your picture.

Week 16**Exodus 14:1-31**

1. According to verses 4 and 17-18, what was the ultimate purpose of the events that took place at the crossing of the Red Sea?
2. How did the people respond when they saw the Egyptians pursuing them?
3. According to verse 25, what did the Egyptians recognize about God, even though they were not among God's people?

Week 17**Exodus 15:1-27**

1. What events does Moses recall to show how “the Lord is a man of war” (verse 3)?
2. How did other nations and people react after they saw what the one true God did for His people, Israel?
3. What rule and promise did God give to the Israelites after giving them sweet water to drink?

Week 18**Exodus 16:1-35**

1. What did some of the people do in the evening that showed a lack of faith?
2. What happened as a result of this lack of faith?
3. Why did the Israelites gather twice as much on the sixth day of each week?

Week 19**Exodus 19:1-25**

1. What did God promise to Israel, and what was the condition of that promise?
2. What preparations were the people told to make before God descended up on the mountain?
3. What restrictions did God put in place for the people around the mountain?

Week 20**Review (Pick One)**

1. Make a list of as many things that you can find in Exodus 15 that show how God protected and provided for Israel after they left Egypt.
2. Write a summary, poem, skit, or song of what you learned from the Bible this week.
3. Draw a picture of what you learned from the Bible this week. Write a brief description of your picture.

Week 21**Exodus 20:1-11**

1. Briefly state the first 4 commandments.
2. What is the common theme found within the first 4 commandments?
3. Anything that is more important than God can be thought of as a false god or an idol. What are some ways that you have personally disobeyed the first two commandments?

Week 22**Exodus 20:12-24**

1. What is the 5th commandment, and what are some ways in which you have personally disobeyed it?
2. What is the common theme of the last 5 commandments?
3. Which commandment does God repeat in verse 23? Why do you think He does this?

Week 23**Exodus 23:1-33**

1. Find at least one law in verses 1-9 that you have broken. What is it and how did you sin against God?
2. What is the purpose behind the Feast of Unleavened Bread?
3. What commandment does God continue to repeat in verses 13, 24, 32, and 33?

Week 24**Exodus 24:1-18**

1. What does verse 2 show us about how holy God is and how different He is from us?
2. What did Moses do after the Lord had finished speaking to him?
3. How did the glory of the Lord appear on the mountain?

Week 25**Review (Pick One)**

1. Make a two-column table. In the first column, briefly write all Ten Commandments. In the second, list ways in which you have disobeyed that commandment (for as many as you are able to).
2. Write a summary, poem, skit, or song of what you learned from the Bible this week.
3. Draw a picture of what you learned from the Bible this week. Write a brief description of your picture.

Week 26**Exodus 32:1-35**

1. How did Aaron respond to the people's request?
2. Briefly summarize the conversation between God and Moses about the golden calf.
3. Why was this such a great sin against God?

Week 27**Exodus 33:1-23**

1. What promise and what warning did God give His people?
2. Why can no one see God's face?
3. How did God pass by Moses? What did Moses see?

Week 28**Leviticus 9:1 – 10:7**

1. What were the 4 types of offerings given by Aaron on behalf of himself and the people?
2. Explain what happened both times we see the consuming fire of the Lord in this passage.
3. What does the incident involving Nadab and Abihu tell us about the importance of taking God's commands seriously?

Week 29**Leviticus 16:1-34**

1. What was to be done with each of the two goats?
2. Why did the atonement need to be made for the people?
3. What aspects of the atonement are symbols of things that Jesus would accomplish on the cross?

Week 30**Review (Pick One)**

1. Make a list of things you learned this week that demonstrate God's holiness and/or our sinfulness.
2. Write a summary, poem, skit, or song of what you learned from the Bible this week.
3. Draw a picture of what you learned from the Bible this week. Write a brief description of your picture.

Week 31**Leviticus 17:1-16, 19:1-10**

1. What is the purpose of the command God gives in Leviticus 17:1-9?
2. What does God say about blood in verses 11 and 14? What command did He give his people regarding eating blood?
3. Because God is holy, what commands does He give in Leviticus 19:1-8?

Week 32**Leviticus 19:11-37**

1. What is the overall theme of verses 13-18?
2. What is the overall theme of verses 33-37?
3. List at least 3 commands given in this passage that you have personally disobeyed. Even though we are no longer under the Old Testament law, what does this tell you about your sinfulness?

Week 33**Leviticus 20:1-27**

1. How can the tragedy of abortion be compared to those in this passage who were sacrificing their children to the false god Molech?
2. What do verses 6 and 27 say about people who try to find out what will happen in the future through fortune-tellers and other similar people?
3. Read Ephesians 5:32. According to God, why is it so important to protect marriage between one man and one woman?

Week 34**Leviticus 26:1-26**

1. Name 3 things God promises to do for His people if they obey (from verses 3-12).
2. What does God remind His people about in verse 13?
3. Name 2 things God promises to do to His people if they disobey (from verses 14-26).

Week 35**Review (Pick One)**

1. Based on the passages from this week, list 4 commands that God gave His people, 4 things He promised to do for them if they obeyed, and 4 things He said He would do to them if they disobeyed.
2. Write a summary, poem, skit, or song of what you learned from the Bible this week.
3. Draw a picture of what you learned from the Bible this week. Write a brief description of your picture.

Week 36**Leviticus 26:27-46**

1. Name 2 things God promises to do to His people if they continue to disobey (from verses 31-33).
2. Name 2 things God promises to do to the people who remain (from verses 36-39).
3. How does God demonstrate His longsuffering in verses 40-46?

Week 37**Numbers 11:1-35**

1. How did the people incorrectly remember their time as slaves in Egypt?
2. What complaint did Moses voice to God in verses 11-15?
3. What unique consequence did God give to those who were complaining about a lack of meat to eat?

Week 38**Numbers 13:1-33**

1. What was this group of Israelites sent out to do?
2. When they returned, what did the majority of the men say about the land and the people in it?
3. Two of these men showed faith in God instead of fear of man. Numbers 14 tells us that Joshua was one of them. Who was the other, and what did he say about the people in the land?

Week 39**Numbers 20:1-29**

1. Compare verse 8 to verses 10-12. How did Moses sin?
2. What consequence did God give to Moses because of this sin?
3. What request did Moses make of the king of Edom? How did the king of Edom respond?

Week 40**Review (Pick One)**

1. Draw two pictures: one picture of the land as viewed by most of the men who went to check it out, and a second picture of the land as viewed by Joshua and Caleb through eyes of faith and trust in God.
2. Write a summary, poem, skit, or song of what you learned from the Bible this week.
3. Draw a picture of what you learned from the Bible this week. Write a brief description of your picture.

Week 41**Numbers 21:1-35**

1. What did God send to the people after they complained against Him this time? What did they have to do in order to live?
2. Read John 3:14-19. How does Jesus compare Himself to the bronze serpent that Moses lifted up?
3. Compare the response that Israel received from the king of the Amorites to the response they received in Numbers 20 from the king of Edom.

Week 42**Numbers 22:1-41**

1. Why were the people of Moab afraid of the people of Israel?
2. Describe Balaam's obedience to God.
3. What unusual thing did God do to get Balaam's attention? Why did the donkey refuse to move?

Week 43**Numbers 23:1-30**

1. When Balak told Balaam to curse Israel, what did Balaam do instead?
2. Based on what he said in verse 8, what did Balaam recognize about God?
3. What 2 truths about God does Balaam state in verse 19?

Week 44**Numbers 24:1-25**

1. In verses 5-9, what did Balaam say about Israel?
2. In verse 10, what did Balak say to Balaam? How did Balaam respond?
3. What things did Balaam say in this passage that show how he recognized God's power and authority?
